Target pollutants for the summer are trash and used motor oil.

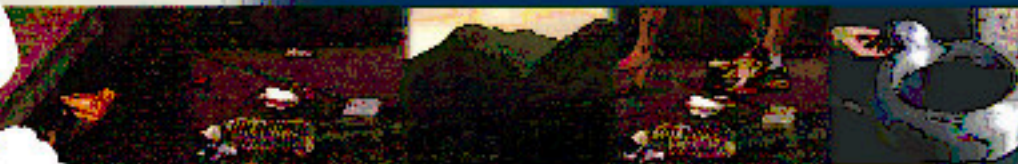
Actions you can do around your home to make a difference.

Trash

1. The most important thing you can do is set a good example. Hold onto your trash until you reach a garbage container. By doing the right thing, you'll encourage others to consider their actions, too.
2. Always carry a liner bag in your car, truck or commercial vehicle.
3. Place your trash in an appropriate bin with a tight-fitting lid that can be securely fastened, if necessary, to keep out animals.
4. Don't put overflowing boxes of loose items out at curbside. Tie papers in a bundle before placing them in a curbside bin.
5. Put your garbage and bulky items out for collection as close to the posted pick up time as possible.
6. Next time you visit the park or beach, carry out all of your trash, empty containers, chip bags, disposable cutlery and uneaten food. Always pack empty garbage and recycle bags to make clean up easier.
7. Keep sidewalks, curbs and gutters fronting your property clean by sweeping up debris and disposing of it in the trash, prior to hosing with plain water. Remember, it is the property owner's responsibility to keep these areas clean.
8. Support community clean ups, recycling programs and other efforts to mobilize local support and reduce litter.

Used Motor Oil

1. For the busy, on-the-go, use an oil change box or pour into a plastic bag with absorbent material, seal the bag and dispose of it in the trash.
2. Take your car to a local business that changes oil and recycles for a fee.
3. United at 662-6264 and Phillip Services at 662-3033 accept used motor oil for a fee.

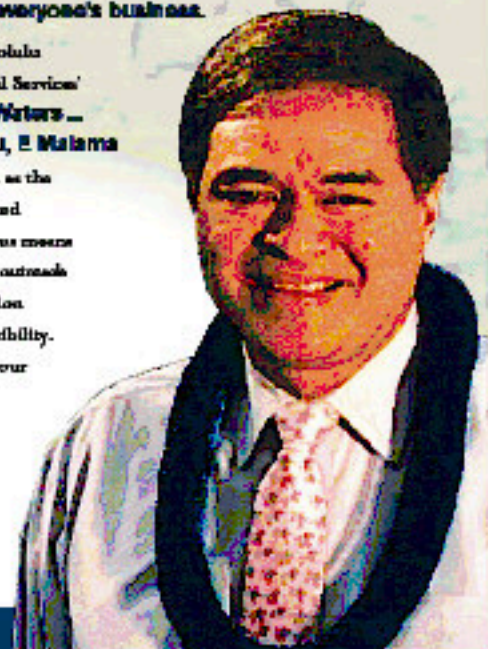
